

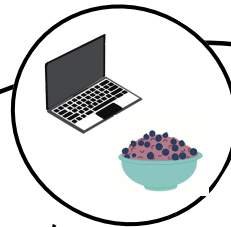

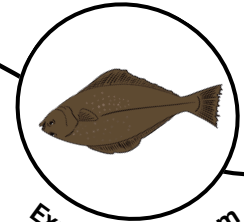

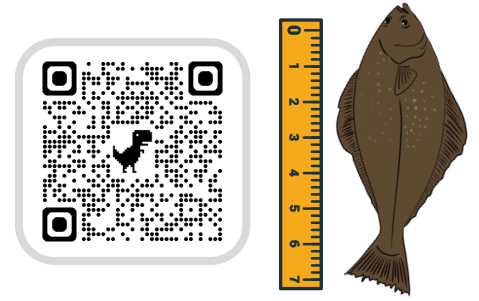
Create each station for families to engage in a variety of activities together!

Copy this page and cut to separate each section to place instructions at each station.

Station #1: Memory Match & Measure (TSG- 11b, 22)

- Scan the QR code to watch a clip about halibut hooks.
- Shuffle the cards. Place face down. Take turns to find matching pairs. Player one turns over two cards. If they are a match, that player will keep the cards.
- After finding all of the matches, put them in order from smallest to largest.

Materials: Memory match cards (template provided), something small to use as a non-standard way to measure or ruler.



Station #2: Halibut String Art (TSG 7, 8)

- Use the string on the stick like a fishing lure. Dip the string into the paint. Then, lay the string in a variety of angles onto the paper. Use multiple colors of strings. Once the paper is covered, dip your fish cookie cutter and stamp that to the end of a line, just like a caught halibut!

**Prepare the sticks with attached string ahead of time.*

Materials: Paper, paint, prepared string on stick, fish cookie cutter

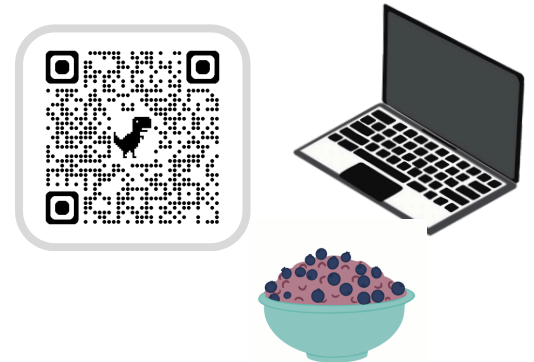
Station #3: Culture Clip & Akutaq (TSG- 11a, 14)

- Explore the sensory bin filled with rice, berries, bowls, and spoons and pretend to make Akutaq together.

Use the QR code:

- Option 1- Set up an ipad near sensory bin station.
- Option 2- Families can scan the QR code and watch from their device.

Materials: Rice, blue & red glass beads, bowls, spoons
